Key Highlights

Summary of KPI Developments

SalMar continues to deliver solid sustainability performance across key operational and environmental indicators. Strong biological performance, efficient resource utilization, and continued progress on climate and environmental indicators provide a solid foundation for sustainable value creation across the Group.

Biological KPIs

SalMar's unwavering focus on fish welfare and producing salmon "on the salmon's terms" continues to be reflected in the Group's biological performance. The Group's rolling twelve-month survival rate at sea currently sits at 95.7%, while smolt survival on land is 95.4%. In Norway, the rolling twelve-month survival rate at sea reached 96.3%, corresponding to a mortality rate of just 3.7%.

This represents the highest survival rate recorded by SalMar in more than 15 years.

Environmental KPIs

Total greenhouse gas emissions increased slightly compared with 2025, primarily due to higher production volumes and a greater share of salmon transported by air during the quarter. Scope 1+2 emissions remained stable despite the increased activity level, primarily driven by a significant transition to biofuels. In the last 12 months, biofuels made up 74% of the Group's fuel usage, compared to 54% in 2025. GHG emission intensity improved to 3.28 tCO₂e per tonne produced, indicating improved carbon efficiency.

This represents the lowest GHG emission intensity recorded by SalMar since setting its GHG emission reduction targets in 2020.

SalMar recorded two fish escape incidents during the quarter: one in Iceland involving a single fish and one in Norway involving ten fish. In total, 36 fish escaped across the Group during the rolling twelve-month period, corresponding to approximately 0.00001% of the Group's total fish population.

Health and Safety KPIs

SalMar recorded six lost time incidents (LTIs) during the quarter, bringing the rolling twelve-month total to 24. The corresponding H-factor was 4.2.
